THE LIFE OF JOSEPH

Lesson 6 – Genesis 45-46

"Then Joseph could not restrain himself..." and he finally reveals his identity to his brothers! In these two chapters we also see more clearly the plan God has been working out through Joseph. God has done as He has purposed to do. Yet, He is far from finished with the individuals and the people He has called to be His own.

Memory Verse – This week's memory verse is Romans 8:28.

Read Genesis 45:1-15.

- 1. In Genesis 45:1 Joseph cleared the room of everyone except his brothers and himself.
 - a. Why would he do this first?
 - b. In Genesis 45:2, when he made himself known to his brothers, what was his emotional reaction?
 - c. How strong were these emotions as revealed in verse 2?
