Lesson 1 - God is Sovereign

Exodus 34:5-6 Now the LORD descended in the cloud and stood with him (Moses) there, and proclaimed the name of the LORD. And the LORD passed before him and proclaimed, "The LORD, the LORD God, merciful and gracious, longsuffering, and abounding in goodness and truth...

This week we will look at the first name(s) the Lord proclaimed to Moses:

> the LORD, the LORD God

Begin this study with prayer, asking the Lord to reveal Himself in His word that you might know Him more.

The Meaning

Lord is a familiar word, but what does it really mean?

Lord – Hebrew – **kýrios**; from a root word meaning (supremacy); it means supreme in authority.

Lord – Thayer's Greek Lexicon – he to whom a person or thing belongs, about which he has the power of deciding; master, lord; the possessor and disposer of a thing, the owner.

Lord – Dictionary definition - someone or something having power, authority, or influence; a master or ruler.

1. There is a lot to that word "Lord"! Considering the definitions above, read Isaiah 45:5 below and take a minute to think about what this really means.

Isaiah 45:5 I am the LORD, and there is no other; There is no God besides Me...

- 2. Let's look deeper. One word you might have noticed in the definitions above is "supremacy". Write a definition below.
- 3. Another word that is closely related to supremacy and also a part of the character of God is "sovereignty." Write a definition for sovereign below.

b. How do their words in verses 17 and 18 reveal their faith in the sovereignty of God?
c. Read Daniel 3:19-25 and share what you see of the manifestation of the power of the Lord and His supremacy.

1. Read Mark 4:35-41 and write below the act of supremacy described.

The Effect of Understanding God's Character

a. What was the attitude of the disciples before this happened?

Consider the two examples we just read. In Daniel we saw three men acting upon their understanding of the sovereignty of God and their faith in His supremacy. In Matthew we saw men acting without this understanding, but then saw the change as their eyes were opened.

b. What was their attitude after it happened? Include the words they spoke in verse 41.

2. What can you do to prepare so that your reaction to a situation is more like the men in Daniel?

4. Read the following verses and share how they can encourage us as we walk through this world with so many things happening that we do not understand.
a. Daniel 2:20-22
b. John 19:10-11
5. How do you think your own understanding of the supremacy and sovereignty of God should affect the attitudes and choices in your own life?
