Lesson 3 - God is Gracious

Exodus 34:5-6 Now the LORD descended in the cloud and stood with him (Moses) there, and proclaimed the name of the LORD. And the LORD passed before him and proclaimed, "The LORD, the LORD God, merciful and gracious, longsuffering, and abounding in goodness and truth...

This week we will look at the third characteristic the Lord proclaimed to Moses:

> Grace
