### **EPHESIANS**

## Lesson 1 – Introduction and Chapter 1:1-6

Paul was a prisoner in Rome when he wrote the Epistle to the Ephesians, a church he knew and loved. This letter was written, not to correct error in the church, but to teach truths to Christians who did not know the riches they have in Christ. It has been an inspiration to new believers as well as those who have walked with the Lord for many years.

As you begin the study of this letter, open your heart to the Spirit, asking Him to give you a new understanding of the riches available to you in Christ.

**Memory Verse** – This week's memory verse is Ephesians 1:3.

"Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places in Christ..."

#### Introduction

It is good for us to have a picture of the city of Ephesus at the time of Paul's visits. Ephesus was one of the leading cities in the eastern provinces of the Roman Empire, ranking with Rome, Corinth, Antioch and Alexandria as the foremost urban centers of the empire. This city boasted the great temple of Artemis (Diana), one of the seven wonders of the ancient world. Paul, being led by the Spirit, visited this pagan metropolitan city and ministered to this Christian church which had been established by Apollos. We can get a better picture of Paul's involvement in Ephesus by looking to the Book of Acts.

#### Read Acts 18:18 – 20:30.

- 1. What do you find out about Paul's first visit to Ephesus in Acts 18:18-21?
- 2. We read about Paul's second visit to Ephesus in Acts 19 and 20. From Acts 19:1-6, what important teaching did Paul bring to Ephesus?
- 3. From Acts 19:8-10, we find that Paul was in the city teaching the Ephesian church for two years before he left on other missionary journeys. We can see Paul still had a real heart for this church. As he was sailing to Jerusalem, even though he could not stop to visit in Ephesus, he sent for the elders to come to him. What do you find that Paul had to share with this church in Acts 20:16-38?
