# **EPHESIANS** Lesson 8 - Chapter 5:15-33

So far in Ephesians 5 we have been instructed to *imitate God* as we *walk in love* and *walk in light*. This week we continue with a third, to *walk in wisdom*. Paul then expands his instruction to submission and how to walk worthy in marriage, using Christ as the example to follow. As you look closer into His word, notice that He has offered Himself as an example of all He asks of you, then He provides all you need to *walk worthy*.

Pray for the Lord to work in you the truths He is presenting in His word this week, guiding you and equipping you to *walk worthy*.

#### Key Word(s)

Read through the entire chapter, looking for words or themes that are repeated. Make note of those words and their significance here.

Memory Verse – This week's memory verse is Ephesians 5:15-16.

"See then that you walk circumspectly, not as fools but as wise, redeeming the time, because the days are evil."

#### Read Ephesians 5:15-17.

- 1. Ephesians 5:15 begins with the words, "See then that you walk circumspectly..."
  - a. Use a definition to explain what it means to *walk circumspectly*?
  - b. How does the rest of the verse add to the description of what it means?
  - c. How is it different to walk circumspectly in the Lord than it is to walk circumspectly in the world?

### Read Ephesians 5:21-33.

During Paul's time in history, Greek and Roman influences had distorted God's order in the home. Fathers, then husbands, had total control over women. In our day, the women's lib movement influenced the home in the opposite direction, with women taking the authority in the marriage. This also distorted God's order in the home. In this section of Ephesians Paul explains God's plan for order in marriage, and we will also see God's plan for submission to the authority He has established in every area of life as we look to *walk worthy*.
